Secretary's Report: ON MOTION the previous month's meeting minutes were accepted as printed in the March Newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Vic-K4VHX reported the balance in our checking account is \$6,343.04 which includes the money received from the Hamfest. Over all income was \$1,571.15 including dues and Hamfest. ON MOTION the treasurer's report was approved as read.

Committee Reports

Publicity – Newspaper listing needs to be change from Friday night to Thursday night. That will be taken care of.

RACES – No report was given.

Testing – Ken-W4JQT stated no license testing is planned for this Saturday.

DX–JR-K9HUY advised an IOTA operation is present on an island off the coast of Mexico. They can be contacted on all bands and are putting out a good signal. Jim-NX2II sent an announcement on the local two meter repeaters reminding everyone of the meeting night change to the third Thursday of each month.

Correspondence

Ken-W4JQT presented a letter to the club with the results of the Hamfest club table sales which was read by the secretary. Totals money received was \$457. Ken even contributed \$20 to get rid of the remaining items. Donations for the table were made by George-KA4JKY, Jerry-K4JWE, John-N1KEN, Marty-W4MHH, Vic-K4VHX, Bruce-K2OY and Jack-KE4IM. Ken-W4JQT and Jim-NX2II manned the table.

A letter was received from the Lemon Bay High School Graduation 2004 committee requesting a donation. The committee holds a drug and alcohol free graduation party for the seniors to keep them safe. A donation of \$100 will be made.

Old Business

Since no further contact with the Charter School in Venice has been made, our involvement in setting up a class on Amateur Radio has been shelved for the time being.

New Business

Member Profile: WA4IWL, An EARS Founding Father

Donald (Don) R. Spencer was born in 1917 in Higganum, CT., and spent his early years in New Britain, CT.

In 1941 he married the love of his life, Edna Hall, who he met early on in Sunday School. They lived many years in Newington and Wethersfield, CT. Don was the proprietor of a paint and wallpaper store in West Hartford, CT.

Don and Edna have 2 daughters, 6 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. They moved to Englewood in 1972 and have lived at his current residence on E. Fray Street since then.

Don has been involved in amateur radio since high school. Before his marriage to Edna, Don owned several

Hallicrafter receivers and built 160 meter breadboard transmitters. Don spent 1944 and 1945 as a electronics technician in the U. S. Navy aboard the battleship USS Wyoming. After WW II, amateur radio was put on the back burner while supporting and nurturing his growing family.

After moving to Florida his love of amateur radio re-emerged and he joined the Tamiami Amateur Radio Club in Venice. He took the radio course the club offered and received his novice ticket, N4IWL, about 27 years ago. He received his general ticket, WA4IWL (I Want Loving), shortly thereafter at the Tampa FCC office.

Don was active in the Venice club, but about 16 years ago he started the Englewood Amateur Radio Society (EARS). The first EARS meeting was held on January 2, 1988. The rest is history. WELL DONE, DON!

George - I've been asked by several EARS and TARC

members if the tone can be switched off on the 146.775 machine. Many of the guys have older 2 meter rigs without tone capability and would like to use both of our repeaters. We have switched off the tone on the 146.700 machine. What say you?

Reply Email:

The PL tone on the 146.775 machine is fixed on and cannot be turned off remotely.

As you may be aware, I also own the 146.700 machine and have a tone on it for many good reasons. One of the reasons is to keep it quiet when skip is here in the spring and summer.

Several years ago there was an idiot in the Miami area that was transmitting garbage on 146,100, before I put the unit on CTCSS and, of course, my machine was retransmitting his garbage, illegally.

The PL decode also keeps intermed from being retransmitted and that is a problem at some times.

Finally, the Florida Repeater Council is about to require CTCSS on all repeaters. I don't mind the tone being turned off during nets, but I prefer that it be left on at other times.
