#### **President's Message**

For those of you up north, July has seen fit to deliver much needed rain. While we need much more to compensate for the dry years, having so much come to us in a short time has left

many puddles and is encouraging the mosquitoes to multiply. The grass keeps growing, but it needs to dry out enough to give me an opportunity to cut it.

At the July meeting many members again expressed how pleased they were with EARS Field Day 2008. Many praised the weather, tents, food, new generator, setup/take down crews, and more. Ken-W1NQT shared some of the stats, including a very respectable number of CW contacts. Ken also advises that next year we should review the GOTA station details and possibly use a separate call sign to prevent having a large number of duplicate contacts.

Marty-N4FA shared the news of a lightning strike at the Sea Oats Nursery that took out the 146.700 MHz repeater along with some other equipment at the nursery. We remain grateful to the folks at Sea Oats for their continued support of the club in allowing our organization to operate equipment at their facility. Moreover, we all owe a great debt of gratitude to Dave-K0DGF for his time and expertise in repeatedly helping EARS maintain, check out, and repair the repeater equipment. Marty has worked with Dave to get a replacement repeater on the air by adding a courtesy tone and identifier to gear Marty had in his possession.

We had some discussion over the FCC requirement for broadcast television stations to switch to digital

only transmissions by February 2009. Coupons that work like credit cards are available to get converter boxes for your non-digital televisions sets. Newer digital televisions may have the digital receiver built-in. If you have cable or satellite and don't use an antenna, no digital converter box is necessary. The boxes are only for over the air broadcasts received through an antenna; some stations are broadcasting both digital and analog signals at present. While the box is not necessary for most folks, their may be some advantage to getting news information through it in the event of a storm or other scenario in which cable service is not available.

Lighthouse weekend is August 16 and 17. Tom-WA3PRC has announced he has the equipment needed to work the airwaves from the Boca Grande Lighthouse and the knowledge of how to do it all, but it will be up to fellow club members to dedicate the labor and time to set up, operate, and take down. If you are interested in participating, please let Tom know and ask what you can do to help out so the event is fun for all.

I will see you at the August 21<sup>st</sup> meeting. There's a rumor that we may even have a program.









