The seating is comfortable and available to all. Bring a scratch pad and pen for notes. This is an excellent weather seminar, that will teach you how to spot severe weather. The slide presentation gets better each time it is given, and is also an excellent refresher for those who are already Skywarn Spotter certified. I know you will enjoy it. When certified you will also periodically receive the Skywarn Spotter News to keep you up to date on Weather happenings.

Please plan on attending. The NWS seminars are few and far between, but important enough to the community for the NWS to travel to our local county's each year to train us in Skywarn Protocol. See you there.
