Originally Licensed in Illinois in 1960.

Currently my main rig is a recently acquired Yaesu FT-950 feeding a Hy-Gain AV-640 Vertical. I also have a Yaesu FT-857 in mobile service, Yaesu FT-897 for portable emergency use, Yaesu FT-2800M for 2 meters, and a Kenwood TH-F6 handheld. And then there is my "green" collection, an assortment of about 20 pieces of Heathkit gear I felt I just had to have.

Previous equipment over the years has included Globe Scout Deluxe Xmtr., Hallicrafters SX-110 Rcvr., Viking Valiant Xmtr., Drake TR-4 Xcvr., and a Kenwood TS-440SAT Xcvr.

My interest in radio seems to have always been there. I built the usual crystal sets and other simple receivers in the late 1940's and early 1950's. I started college in 1956, we won't discuss how long it took me to finish, and in 1960 I was taking a Physics Department Electronics course when I decided to get a ham license. Got the Novice ticket and shortly after made the big trip to the FCC Office in St. Louis to take the General Exam. When the Advanced Class was authorized, I upgraded.

I have never directly used Ham Radio in any job, but Ham Radio got me a job that turned out to be my lifelong career. I was very active in the old "Civil Defense" exercises held in our

area in the early 1960's. In that regard I met a ham who worked for an industrial insurance company as a Fire Protection Inspector. He had been promised a promotion if he could find someone to take his place locally. Sounded good to me and I eventually specialized in petroleum fire protection systems relocating to England, Houston and traveling the world all thanks to Ham Radio.

My first contact was as a Novice with the Globe Scout, 75 watts of strictly crystal controlled CW.

My most interesting radio contacts were made while operating the Phillips Petroleum Station, LA1EKO, in the Ekofisk Oil Field off the coast of Norway. The station was located atop a 42,000,000 gallon oil storage tank about 350' above the surface of the North Sea.

I currently operate about 99% SSB.

Occasionally I will put one of the Heath Rigs on the air and try good old AM. I also operate some straight key slow speed CW with 2 watts from a Heathkit HW-8.

I prefer the Rag Chew type of contact to the "you're 5 x 9, best 73's", but I do play that game because I love to collect QSL's.

+ Spotlight on Amateur Radio: 2009 Sees Surge of New Amateur Radio Licensees

This past year was a banner year for new Amateur Radio licensees. According to ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, the FCC issued more than 30,000 new ham radio licenses. "In 2009, the demand for Amateur Radio exam sessions remained elevated and is still running at a higher rate than before the FCC's restructuring of the license requirements in 2007," Somma said. "This high level of exam session activity has produced an elevated influx of new applications, far outpacing recent years." A total of 30,144 new licenses were granted in 2009 -- an increase of almost 7.5 percent from 2008. In 2005, 16,368 new hams joined Amateur Radio's ranks; just five years later, that number had increased by almost 14,000 -- a whopping 84 percent!
