QSL By The Bureau

Written By: Jack Sproat-W4JS Incoming – The radio societies in most countries maintain QSL Bureaus. This holds true here in the USA where there is an ARRL sponsored incoming. DX QSL bureau service. Membership in the ARRL is not required to utilize the incoming QSL bureau service. Due to the large number of DXers in the Fourth District, there are two bureaus to serve their needs. If you r call sign has a single letter prefix (K4, N4, etc.) you will receive incoming DX QSLs from

If your call sign has a two letter prefix (WA4, KG4, etc.) your incoming QSLs will be from:

Sterling Park Amateur Radio Club Call Box 599 Sterling, FA 20167

The fourth District bureaus require that you have a supply of common 6"x9" pre-stamped, pre-addressed envelopes on file with them. Some bureause work on a prepaid basis, furnishing the envelopes and telling you when they need more money from you.

These two bureaus are only for call signs with a "4" in them. Even though you live here in the 4th district, if you have any other number in your prefix you can oly do business with the bureau in that particular call district, e.g., N1RA would receive incoming DX QSLs via the 1st District Bureau. Check the address on your call district bureau on the ARRL web site or contact the ARRL directly.

Outgoing – To utilize the outgoing DX QSL Bureau you must be a member of the ARRL. Up to 10 outgoing QSLs can be sent for \$1, 20 for \$2, and up to 30 for \$3. After that, the rate is \$4/half-pound of QSLs. Arrange the cards in alphabetical order by prefix and enclose a check for the proper amount along with proof of ARRL membership.

One word about QSL cards. Most QSLs are printed only on one side, however, many cards now have only artwork and the call sign on the front and the report form is on the backside. Always make sure that your card has your call sign – repeated if necessary – on the report side of the card. That allows the Dxer or his QSL manager to get all the QSO information off one side of the card rather than having to flip back and forth between the calls sign and the report form.

Renewing/Modifying an Amateur License

Renewing or modifying an Amateur license is not very simple anymore! If you haven't done business with the FCC since December 2001, you probably do not have a FRN--which you must have to renew your license. Internet access to the ARRL or Buckmaster data bases should indicate your status--but not always.

Using paper forms for renewal/modification can take two routes:

1. Via the ARRL with the NCVEC Form 605, which is free if you're an ARRL member, otherwise it will cost \$12.50 at a VE session. Going this route, you can still use your SSN.

2. Via the FCC with Form 605, which requires use of the FRN. You must first apply for a FRN with Form FCC 160, receive the FRN and then apply for the renewal, modification, etc.

The FCC packet of forms is available via http://www.fcc.gov/Forms/Form605/605html. Jack Sproat-W4JS also has the latest forms on hand.

ULS System Make-Over--

The FCC unveiled the new on-line Universal Licensing System (ULS) filing interface on 14 December. Among other features, the ULS make-over will include easier to read on-screen form that guide users through filing and simplify such routine tasks as applying for license renewal, address change, or vanity call sign.

The ULS will require filers to log onto the system using a FCC Registration Number (FRN) and Commission Registration System (CORES) password. The FCC will no longer accept a Social Security Number (SSN) for log-in purposes.

There's also a new paper version of Form FCC 605 for license renewal, address change, etc. This form no longer requests a date of birth, but it will only accept a FRN and not a SSN.
