ARES E-Letter for December 20, 2006

Letter provided by: Vic-K4VHX

Controversy swirls about the Red Cross requiring background checks, and our section's policy is that ARES works under government emergency management, not the Red Cross.

In the EOC, the Red Cross has its own ESF number, and Communications has its own ESF number. A shelter is opened by emergency management, requesting it under the Red Cross ESF. Communication is provided to that shelter under the Communications ESF at the request of emergency management to the local EOC.

Untested yet, but Red Cross doesn't seem to be in a position to demand clearance of persons working in shelters under control of the EOC. At least that's the current thinking of our section's leadership.
