EARS Field Day 2002

The EARS 2002 Field Day was held in the unpaved parking area of the Englewood United Methodist Church, 700 East Dearborn St., Englewood, Florida.

The antenna setup crew arrived early Friday morning June 21, and soon had a 125 foot wire dipole strung up between two trees. The next antenna to go up was the Cushcraft R7000 vertical. A 6 meter 5 element beam on a 30 foot push up pole was set up Saturday morning, just before a severe thunderstorm brought lots of rain. Our tent, which had been set up the day before by the church youth group survived the storm and kept us mostly dry. The antenna setup crew consisted of Vic-KF4VHX, Howard-KD4MMY, Tom-WA3PRC, Pam-KG4EDF, and Colin-KG4EDG, Don-WA4IWL, Ken-W1NQT, Frank-W4VV, and Ken-W4JQT.

Transceivers, power supplies, and antennas were provided by JR-K9HUY, Tom-WA3PRC, Vince-KG4AIV, and Ken-W4JQT. John-W1JF provided an 8 foot ground rod, and three rolls of coax cable.

Ken-W1NQT arranged for logging computers and programs, handled publicity with the newspapers, and copied the ARRL CW Bulletin. He also agreed to submit

the field day scores. There was an excellent story and pictures in the Sun Herald on the front page.

Howard-KD4MMY made arrangements for the site, rental and installation of the tent, tables and chairs, generators and gasoline, extension cables, and set up his fifth wheel trailer for back up shelter. Howard also tended the generators during the 24 hour field day period, and managed the overall operation as Field Day Chairman.

Don-WA4IWL made arrangements for the bath rooms in church fellowship hall to be open during the field day period and notified the Sheriff of our activity.

Vic-KF4VHX kept enough operators on site to keep the stations going. Operators for the CW station were JR-K9HUY, Vincent-KG4AIV, Ken-W1NQT, Dan-K4OU, and Jack-WA4GRO.

Operators for the phone stations were Tom-WA3PRC, Bobby-KF4YOW, Howard-KD4MMY, Ken-W4JQT, Vic-KF4VHX, Pam-KG4EDF, Colin-KG4EDG, Bryce-KG4EDE, Matthew-KE4VEM, Howard-N4MLJ, Don-WA4IWL, and Mark-KE4UFT.

The 6 meter station activity was occasional with a contact now and then until about 10 am Sunday morning when the band opened up. With JR-K9HUY operating and Ken-W4JQT logging. Over 200 contacts were made in about two hours.

Connie White handled the picnic after field day operations shut down, and a wonderful picnic it was. Frank-W4VV kept things going on the grill. The weather cooperated very nicely for the picnic.

Matthew-KE4VEM, Mark-KE4UFT, and Michael-KF4KDI and friends arranged to be home from school this weekend, and brought a computer to be used for logging. They also helped clean up and put things away, and did some operating.

All on hand helped take down and load equipment and put things away. Jerry-K4JWE was not able to be at field day, but was there to help take down antennas and get things loaded up.

We had a very good Field Day with lots of participation and I think it was enjoyed by all who came. The picnic was a wonderful wrap up of a fine week end. I apologize for any names I may have missed, and express my thanks for all who pitched in and helped. Be careful about missing future meetings - You may get elected chairman next year, as I did this year.
