I met Michael Dalton, W2NPN, in September of 1959, when he moved from Hyde Park, N. Y. to W. Haverstraw, N. Y. to attend Haverstraw High School for his senior year.

**Message From The President** 

Mike and I became "best friends" and he introduced me to amateur radio. I remember entering his "shack" and asking what all the electronic equipment was for. He said he was a "ham" and the equipment was a transmitter and a receiver he used to contact hams all around the world using "CW" and voice to "rag chew". Strange terminology! He said he got his first amateur license when he was 10 years old and was an active "DXer", whatever that was. I looked around the shack and noticed several ARRL awards and thousands of "QSL" cards, both in stacks and covering the walls. He showed me his "DX-100, HQ-100, bug" and the new electronic "key" he had made. He went on the "air" and called "CQ". The next thing I heard was another ham responding to his call. He wanted me to speak to the guy but I had a severe case of "mike fright". So that ended that.

Mike asked if I could help him "string" his new "straight wire antenna" and "tune" it . I helped him by standing at the end of a 160 meter long wire with a 200 watt light bulb. He told me to yell when the light bulb was at its brightest. I yelled alright; I got my first "RF" burn.

My first experience with amateur radio was NOT pleasant.

Once again I would like to thank the Englewood Amateur Radio Society for your generous scholarship. I will put it to good use at MCC.
