146.700 MHz Repeater Call Sign

This call-sign is presently being modified to N4EAR, if possible. Right now N4FA is being used until we receive our new call-sign. An application to do this was submitted to the FCC on 17 May. This was made possible by the generosity on Dave Kelce-K0DGF who has given the 146.700 machine hardware and peripherals to EARS. In addition, Dave has arranged for EARS to obtain a 15 year, no cost, lease of the site and access. Thank you, Dave.
