# **Amateur Extra Candidates**

Last year, Tamiami ARC member Andy Durette-KB1HIP developed and presented training sessions for General class hams interested in upgrading to Extra class. These were weekly sessions that ran about 6 or 8 weeks. Of the eight trainees in those classes every one that subsequently took the Extra exam passed it. So, it appears that Andy did a great job getting the material across to the trainees.

# From Andy Durette-KB1HIP Hi Guys,

I am making final preparation for the Extra Class Prep Course. I suggest that we meet once a week on Monday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00PM starting March 7. I was able to find a suitable place to hold the course through Jim Murdock's help. The meeting place is: First Christian Church 1100 Center Road Venice, FL 34292. This location is a short distance going east on Center Road from Jacaranda Blvd near Peaches Restaurant. The last time I gave the Extra Class prep course it took 12 weeks to complete the material. We are flexible here so if we need more or less time we can modify the schedule accordingly. I need to order License Manuals if you don't have one already. The ARRL manual is \$15.38 (list price 24.95) from Amazon. Free shipping for more than one manual. There is a new Revision 9 which includes a CD with random practice exams on it. It is not yet available from Amazon. You can order it directly from ARRL for \$29.95 plus shipping.. The other option is Gordon West's manual for \$ 24.95 plus shipping. The ARRL manual has more detailed information and is more difficult to use although I plan to extract the important information from it for the class. Gordon's manual focuses directly on the questions in the Extra Class Exam and can be used as a supplement to the material that I will hand out. As an instructor I can get a small discount if I order more than 5 Gordon West's manuals. (Total cost \$23/ea) Please advise.
