Mr. DiBello was born July 27, 1925, in Middletown, N.Y. He served three years in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He attended St. Lawrence University in Canton, N.Y. In 1949 he graduated from the University of Texas-Pan American in Edinburg, Texas.
