Get your beams oriented toward the land down under. Just outside the Great Barrier Reef in the Coral Sea lies Willis Island. The time frame of Nov.14-23 and operate 24 hrs a day and will include two week ends and plans to be operational as VK9WA using CW,SSB, and RTTY on 1.8-28 MHz

Other Dxpeditions from various corners of the Globe will include: 3B8/3B9 Mauritius and Rodrigues. Matthias, DF6LO, will be operating in the Indian Ocean during November and December. His first stop will be Rodrigues Island(AF-049) as 3B9/DF6LO sometime in November. Next is Mauritius Island (AF-049) as 3B8/DF6LO sometime in December. Using aFT-857D running on 30 W on JT65 and at times 100 W on CW.QSL via LoTW and eQSL only.

3C --- Equatorial Guinea. Fresh from his mid-September D67GIA Dxpedition to Comoros Island, LA7GIA is heading for Malabo Island (AF-010), which also counts as Equatorial Guinea. He has received his written conformation of his 3C7GIA license and expects to pick up the originals "upon arrival in 3C". Activity will b n 7-28 MHz on all modes. Sorry, but no 160 or 80 meters. On 20, 15, and 10 meters he'll be using mosely beams, and on the other bands a Hy-Gain verticals which can 500 W..His web page is la7gia.com/3c7gia/index.html.

3W--- Vietnam November 23 to December 5 are the expected dates that Mats SM3LRR will be operating on HF CW, SSB and digital modes as XV2D. QSL via LoTW.

S7—Seychelles . Six IOTA operators have announced plans to activate Coetivy Island (AF-119 NEW) for a first IOTA activation in mid November. They plan to operate for 6 days sometime in mid November 16-23 time frame. They plan to operate for 6 days sometime in the November 16-23 time frame. They will use the call S79C on 7-50MHz on CW,SSB, and RTTY. The team of highly experienced IOTA activators will include EA3NT, EI9FBB, MM0NDX, PA3EWP, SP5APW, and VK8CE.
