MY DAYS WITH A LIVING LEGEND BY LINDA POWERS

In mid-November I was fortunate enough to spend five days with world-renowned conchologist, author, and special friend, Peter Dance. At the personal invitation of mutual friend, Harlan Wittkopf, Rita Stonehouse and I spent most of the week of November 16th with these two honorary members of the Englewood Shell Club.

It was hoped that Peter could spend the day with club members on our trip to Palm Island. But as most know, low tides are critical to shellers and Peter and Harlan shelled the low tides off Marco Island on that day. In lieu of that, however, I had Peter all to myself on Veteran's Day. We spent the day at the Edison & Ford Winter Estate where Peter charmed the staff into admitting both of us for free. We then visited Larry Strange at his shop on Sanibel, where both compared shelling lore and stories. Peter and I then had a very late lunch at The Mucky Duck, where he again managed to get us a free bowl of chowder. That evening was spent in the company of the Wittkopfs and illustrator/artist Ken Vinton and his wife Mary Ann.

Peter and Harlan's purpose for this visit was to attend the Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum's 20th Anniversary celebration. Peter gave a 6-minute talk about his coauthor and friend, R. Tucker Abbott and Tucker's contribution to the fledging museum. Peter and Harlan signed copies of Harlan's book, Gems To Treasure: Of Seashells and Friendship, of which proceeds went to purchase a commemorative brick for Tucker.

Once the hub-bub of the party was over, Peter was able to spend his remaining time on Sanibel relaxing and enjoying the island. Peter was very ill a little over a year ago and most thought his trip to the U.S. in 2011 was his last. But he recovered fully and was healthy, robust, and as astute as ever. We swam, we shelled the beach, we dined, and we talked and talked and talked. Rita and I were able to stay in the condo right next to the Wittkopf's and Peter, and what a joy to wake up, have coffee, and listen to Peter tell tales about the writing of The Compendium and his friendship with Tucker Abbott. Not only has Peter earned the title of The Living Legend, but he is also a true English gentleman, and a very loyal friend. It was a once-in-a-lifetime event for both Rita and I.
