Rough seas in the sky? Just what is an Undulatus Asperatus? Early one Fall morning as I was finishing my breakfast dishes and watching my favorite TV show, The Weather Channel, a meteorologist was reporting on a new cloud formation referred to as undulatus asperatus. Now I remember the basic cloud formations we all learned in science classes growing up – the cumulus, stratus, cirrus and nimbus, so why the need for another cloud name? Well, I grabbed my cup of tea sat down at my computer and Googled The Cloud Appreciation Society's (CAS) website. Low and behold there were some fascinating pictures of these beautiful clouds.

Now you may ask why I am writing about clouds in a shell club newsletter? Here's the interesting fact. The clouds look like the surface of the sea on a choppy day, which is why the CAS is proposing these clouds be called asperatus from the Latin verb 'aspero', meaning to make rough. The term was used by Roman poets to describe the sea as it was roughened by the cold north wind. As we know, rough seas bring in those coveted hard to find shells. Sighting of these clouds in Florida are not as common as other parts of the country. The cost for each class is the same as last year, \$7. In some cases there may be additional charges based on the particular craft.



Here's what you can look forward to for the 2012 – 2013 Season and don't forget the new location & times!



November 15 – Shell Bracelet (Eunice Herr), Christmas Pins, Christmas Decorations The shell bracelet is made with small shells that will be attached to a silver chain bracelet with jump rings. Each crafter will receive a kit which will include small shells, bracelet, caps to be glued to the shells, and jump rings to attach shells to bracelet. Glue and tools will be provided and will be shared by crafters. There will be an additional charge for the kit which will be announced at a later date.







January 17 – Mirrors (Linda Maggiore) Driftwood Wooden frames with mirrors, hangars, etc. will be provided. In addition to the \$7 charge for the session, there will be an additional \$7 charge for materials for a total of \$14. Linda will bring samples to the November meeting since the normal December meeting will be replaced with our annual Christmas Luncheon on December 11.

Shell Crafters Con't.

February 21 – Flowers (Diane Herger and Cindy Gettle) Pots/Urns decorated with shells

- 1) Iris: It is made using northern mussels and centers. Shells will be supplied. You will need to bring hot glue, 18 gauge stem wire, needle nose pliers and white craft glue.
- 2) Hydrangea: made with three small cup shells glued together with a mustard seed as a center. A total of 100 flowers glued on a 2-1/2" Styrofoam ball. Supplies will be \$2.00/bag of cup shells, 18 gauge stem wire, and a 2 -1/2" Styrofoam ball, mustard seed and hot glue. This flower will need to be started before the craft teaching date.

March 21 – Baskets decorated with shells

LINDA SHOCKLEY'S WINKING PERIWINKLE Join us on November 13 to view some fascinating creatures when Linda Shockley, award-winning* shell collector and full-time Marco Island, Florida resident, will present "Seashells and Shell Makers.

Linda has lived full time on Marco Island since January 2002. Before making her home there, she traveled the world while serving 30 years as a soldier, enlisting in the U.S. Army as a Private in 1971, and retiring at the rank of Colonel (O6).

Developing an interest in seashells after retirement, she has spent many low tides searching for great shells around Marco's beaches, mud-flats, and sandbars. Fascinated by the living mollusks that produce such beautiful shells, she began studying and photographing these interesting creatures in their diverse habitats

Drawing on 10 years of observation and study, Linda will bring these sea creatures alive with her photographs and share some fascinating facts about Marco's marvelous mollusks!
