If you have traveled far afield (or have just returned from "Up North" and haven't shared your summer finds), bring your shells. They do not have to be from Southwest Florida!!! This meeting, as all others, will begin with identification of shells brought by members.

Study group is chaired by Linda Powers, but since she is also President of the Club this year, Anita Wilson will be joining Linda as co-chair. All ESC members, both club veterans and newbies, are welcome at Study Group. The purpose of Study Group is to identify shells found by members and to learn more about those shells. For example, these questions and more may be answered: Am I most likely to find this shell on the beach or in the bay? What other shells are related to this one? What did the animal that lived in this shell look like? What did it eat? Where did it live? How did it reproduce? Just what do we mean by good shell etiquette? What can I do to assure that shells remain abundant on our beaches?

If you have copies, always bring the following books along with interesting shells to study group: "Florida's Fabulous Seashells and Other Seashore Life" by Winston Williams; "Florida's Living Beaches: A Guide for the Curious Beachcomber" by Blair and Dawn Witherington; and "Compendium of Seashells" by R. Tucker Abbott and S. Peter Dance. Bring any other favorites you would like to share with the group. Remember to attend the November meeting, since Study Group does NOT meet in December because of holiday events. We'll see you November 30 at 2:00 p.m.


Outreach Programs Tori Weaver and Darlene Gallentine
