Welcome back Shellcrafters!

We will be kicking off the season on Friday, October 10, at Englewood Elks at 9:00AM. For our first meeting, we will make Christmas ornaments to replace the worn ornaments used on the Cedar Park Christmas tree. The 2014 Conchologists Of America convention was held at the Hilton Wilmington Riverside in Wilmington, NC. August 9 - 15. The North Carolina Shell Club really went all out to make the convention one of the best. It was a pleasure to represent the ESC at this convention.
