I was honored to represent the Englewood Shell Club at this year's Conchologist of America (COA) Convention in Weston, FL.

COA was sponsored by The Broward Shell Club and they deserve high praise, starting with our "goodie bags" and ending with the all-shell handmade alligator favors for everyone at the Banquet.

All lectures were informative and entertaining, but of special note was Paul Kanner's "California Shells & Collecting in California Waters" and Jerry Harasewych's "Yo Ho Ho and a Bottle of Shells" about finding shells within bottles in a submersible off the coast of Curacao. Dr. Leal of the Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum also had a fascinating talk on "Biomimetics and Mollusks" discussing biomaterials being developed by observing and analyzing seashells. Kevan Sunderland provided the grande finale with "The Everglades Ecosystem and Its Residents", a fascinating and extraordinary slide show of his personal photographs of every Florida creature imaginable.

At the Club Representative's meeting, I learned that ESC is in a unique position with a growing membership. The Broward Club, too, has lots of members but most clubs are struggling to find new members.

The Chicago Shell Club gave a very enthusiastic presentation on the upcoming COA Convention in Chicago July 27-31, 2016. I would like to encourage more of our members to become involved in COA.
