#### **Unique Shells with the Re-nourishment**

There were some very unusual shells coming ashore with the beach re-nourishment this summer. Some of them we would have trouble classifying via the Compendium. For example, Anita Wilson found a 0.50 caliber machine gun SHELL casing. As she researched the markings on the base (43 SL), she found it was manufactured in St. Louis in 1943! It has been out there in the bay ever since and still looks pristine. Most of us were aware of the WWII training bases in Venice and Punta Gorda. Anita remembers the story of how the guys stationed in Venice were sent on hikes down to the old gray barn in Englewood (finally torn down this year). There they met the girls of Englewood; several romances flourished! It ends up there was also a training base in Sarasota. All three bases handled groups of about 1100 men at a time; of those, about 200 were pilots. They all did target practice over the gulf and they were instructed to use every shell in the round, so there would not be any live ammunition left out there. The first men arrived in November of 1943; groups trained here until the war ended. This shell, which is four inches long, is the biggest treasure Anita found from the re-nourishment. Both she and Linda Powers found giant bittersweet clam

shells, close to 3 inches long. Linda Masterson found a perfect very large Scotch bonnet. There have also been lots of ziczac scallops (flats) and turbans. A member of Turtle the Patrol found a junonia! We are sure others also have found treasures. We would love to learn about them. Anita encourages everyone to keep looking, even though she admits her latest find was not a shell. She found a 2.5 inch *Carcharodon megalodon* shark's tooth on July 8.

One 16oz canned whole tomatoes (do not drain)

1/2 peeled cucumber

1 clove garlic

1/4 cup Balsamic vinegar

1/3 cup olive oil
