BUSINESS MEETING:

Following the program, the business meeting was called to order by Presidents Meredith Blain and Martha Dehne. Judy Kauk reported a current balance of \$5213.13. Current membership stands at 74 members.

BEACH WALKS: Deborah Hubbard announced the next beach walk would be at Nokomis Beach at 9 a.m. December 16. Park in the first parking lot as you arrive at the beach. Among the points she made were the facts that the oyster is "edible, but considered unpalatable" and that they can be used to make pearls by inserting seed, but this is not done in the US.

SHELLCRAFTERS: The Presidents announced Judy Kauk would be leading a workshop making polymer clay seashells at Lemon Bay Park Pavilion 10 a.m. Nov. 20. All supplies will be provided, so there will be a small fee of \$3.00 to cover supplies. The December craft session will be Dec. 18.
