Call to Order: President Martin Horowitz-W4MHH opened the meeting at 7:30PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 24 members and one guest, Konrad Owens-WA3RRS, in attendance.

Secretary's Report: ON MOTION the October meeting minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Vic-K4VHX reported in the past month we had \$279.50 income and \$81 outflow.

Balance is \$4.658.23. ON MOTION the treasurer's report was approved.

Correspondence: Received a thank you note from the United Methodist Church for the overhead projector the club donated to them. Received a letter of appreciation from the Englewood Charlotte Public Library for the demonstration EARS members presented to the children during the summer. Committee Reports

- *Sunshine*: No report.
- ► *RACES*: Frank-W4VV reminded all of the check-ins on the last Wednesday of the month at 8PM, 146.745MHz; and the last Thursday of the month at 9AM at the Tringali EOC, 146.865MHz. Frank reported that the club responded and performed well during Hurricane Charley.
- Publicity: Gerry-K4JWE and others said response to the EARS display at Elsie Quirk library has been very favorable.
- Testing: Ken-W4JQT reminded everyone that testing now takes place the 2nd Saturday of the month at the Venice Library in conjunction with TARC.
- ▶ DX: VU2RBI is expecting, within days, permission to operate as VU4/ from Andaman Islands. She, Devulapalli, is planning on being there for the month of Dec. This is very rare. No activity since 1978. PY1, Peter Island, near the Antarctic Circle, is due up in January. No one there for about 10 years. FT8X, Kerguelen Islands, will be coming up on March 15. Last operation was 1998. See pages 77 &78, Dec. QST for more info.
- ▶ Hamfest: Vic, K4VHX, advised that we would have to run the Hamfest ourselves, as PRRC members have too much going on due to Hurricane Charley. This is a very difficult job and needs full time attention by several people. As there were no volunteers to take this on, a discussion was held to invertigate the possibility a tailgate Hamfest on the EUMC grounds. Ken, W4JQT, will check with the church to see if this is possible. We are shooting for March 5, 2005.

Old Business

Only four members were able to make the Boca Bop, but everything went off well.

Ken-W4JQT, moved and Gerry-K4JWE, seconded a motion to give a \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior at Lemon Bay High School. Motion passed. Martin-W4MHH will contact the cognizant people at the high school to arrange the requirements and presentation.

Englewood Animal Rescue Sanctuary, the other "EARS", was discussed. Ken-W4JQT, moved and Don, WA4IWL, seconded a motion, that we do not pursue further action against them for using "EARS" as their acronym. Motion passed (23 to 1).

Our withdrawal from the Chamber of Commerce was discussed. Bill-W1AMU, moved and Ken-W4JQT, seconded that we rejoin the Chamber. Motion failed (19 to 5).

New Business

ARRL bylaws state that a club needs 60% or more ARRL members to maintain being a ARRL affiliated club. A show of hands affirmed that status for EARS. If any EARS member wants to become a member of ARRL, and does it through EARS, our club will receive \$15 per new member. Any renewal through the club nets us \$2. This is a good way to support EARS. Full membership dues are \$39 per year for ARRL with discounts for other categories.

EARS dues for 2005 are \$15 per member (\$18.50 for a family membership). They are due.

Martin-W4MHH appointed a nominating committee consisting of JR-K9HUY and Gerry-K4JWE to recommend a slate of candidates for the 2005 EARS officers. Presentation of the slate will take place at our December meeting, which will be held in conjunction with the EARS Christmas party on December 12th.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The program was presented by Vic-K4VHX giving a demonstration of Anderson powerpoles and Ken-W4JQT demonstrating techniques for attaching PL259 connecters to coax.
