Correspondence

We received a request form the Lemon Bay High School to participate in the Senior Awards Night (the EARS Scholarship) as we did last year in awarding a scholarship (\$500.00) to a deserving graduate. This was tabled for discussion at our November meeting.

A letter was written by our President on October 3rd to the Englewood Animal Rescue Sanctuary regarding their use of the acronym "EARS". The negative publicity that organization has generated affects us. Our good name and works are jeopardized. We have received denigrating remarks from local people and businesses when the acronym is used, until they are told we are not the animal people but the Amateur Radio Society. This was pointed out in the letter, and they were asked to change their name. A suggestion was made to use Englewood Animal Rescue League and EARL, or the like. This change would resolve the conflict between their organization and ours.

We received a letter from Peggy Hauptman, Founder & President of the Englewood Animal Rescue Sanctuary. The following are excerpts:

- "On the surface I am surprised and saddened that you would have the temerity to besmirch our fine organization...."
- "While we appreciate your concern for the drop in support for your organization, it is unfair and lessens your credibility to blame other organizations. One should first carefully examine their internal approaches and changes for possible flaws."

"We are proud to share our acronym with your organization and always clarify any comments or confusion by the public when encountered, which is seldom. We hope your organization can rise above the comments in your letter and we wish you success in your efforts."

Basically, what Hauptman is saying is "bug off". I, for one, would like to pursue this further but need all the resources our members can bring to bear for an amicable settlement. Please let me know what you want to do. Martin, W4MHH.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10PM.
